Documentation of own solo exhibition: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparatory works (preliminary proposals / sketches / drafts) for own artistic work • Description of the work; medium, material, measurements etc. • Sketches / pictures / other documentation of the art work's presentation • Text presenting, contextualizing and reflecting upon the artwork 3. Descriptions and reflections on participation in workshops <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visual documentation of works made in connection with workshops • A short description of the content of workshops • Reflection on own learning outcome 4. Description and reflections on offered artist talks, studio visits.
