Dear Lise,

I hereby want to apply for funding for my research stay at Wellington University, New Zealand. The exact dates of my proposed stay are not yet confirmed; however it will be approximately from September 2023 until March 2024.

PURPOSE OF THE RESEARCH VISIT

During my research stay, I want to work with Professor Joanna Mossop. Joanna is a very well-established figure in our branch, and a partner of NCLOS. Her research interests and expertise largely coincide with mine, as she has published on dynamic marine protected areas (which is my PhD topic), the BBNJ negotiations, and many other topics that are relevant to my research. Along with my main supervisor, Richard Barnes, she is involved in a project on '*Reimagining ocean law to achieve equitable and sustainable use of marine ecosystems*'. The main purpose of this visit is to work with Joanna, who, as said, has very specialized knowledge about my topic, even more so than my current team of supervisors. For this reason, I think this visit could be very beneficial for my research. Going to New Zealand would be a good opportunity for me to draw from her knowledge, expand my horizon and, most importantly, get a lot of writing done before my mid-term in March 2024.

In addition, I may want to use this visit to find answers to my first research question, i.e.: *Are existing ABMTs an effective means to protect marine biodiversity, and to what extent can any deficit in effectivity be attributed to the static nature of their design?* This question has empirical connotation, and in order to answer it I may need to do some field work, such as conducting interviews. New Zealand has many MPAs in place, and given that the legal frameworks surrounding them are all in English (and thus more accessible for me compared to, say, Norwegian legislation) this would be a good opportunity to do some empirical work. Of course, I would have to delve into the technicalities of doing empirical research and carefully consider whether or not I should include this in my research.

- Budget with plan for financing.
